
# Three Training Dives for Open Water Students

## Instructor Development Course (IDC) starts February 25th, 2000

SJS's PADI Course Director, Ernie Miller, will start a Instructor Development Course (IDC) in conjunction with Scuba Adventures PADI 5-Star IDC Center. The course includes dive theory development, academic teaching presentations, confined water teaching presentations, and open water training. Upon completion, candidates will earn the PADI Assistant Instructor (AI) rating and be qualified to set for a PADI Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI) examination (IE) conducted by PADI. Duties of the PADI AI include teaching academic sessions, teaching limited confined water skills and surface skill evaluation during Open Water training. AI's may also independently teach Snorkeling, Peak Performance Buoyancy, Discover Scuba, Medic First Aid Equipment Speciality, and the new Bubblemaker program. AI's are one of the most valuable assets of a Dive Training Team. OWSI's are authorized to teach Open Water and Jr. Open Water, Advanced Open Water, Rescue Diver, Divemaster, and Peak Performance Buoyancy.

#### Do you know the name of everyone you dive with?

We don't mean Bob or Becky or Bill or Bonnie...we mean Fairy Basslet and Blue Hamlet and Rock Beauty and Spotfin Butterfly. How well do you know the fish you dive with? Would your dives be more enjoyable if you could name the most of the fish? With a little knowledge and some practice, every diver can learn many of the names and some of the more interesting habits of the fish you dive with on your next trip. Interested? Project AWARE and REEF (Reef Environmental and Education Foundation) have teamed up to offer a new PADI specialty course, AWARE Fish ID. The course is a fun way to learn the most common fish sighted on the reefs of Florida, the Caribbean, and the Bahamas. It is great way to supercharge your next diving vacation. The course is made up of a twohour class room session and two open water dives. The AWARE Fish ID course is being offered to everyone going on a SJ Scuba trip. A companion course also available is the PADI Underwater Naturalist specialty course. Contact instructors Ernie Miller or John Stuart if you are interested.

#### More about REEF...

The Reef Environmental Education Foundation (REEF), founded in 1990, is a grass-roots, not-profit, organization of amateur divers who regularly conduct fish surveys during their dives. The organization was founded by Paul Humann, the photographer and author of the Reef Fish ID books most divers are familiar with, and is similar to the Audubon Society's amateur bird watching program.

If you enjoyed what you learned in the AWARE Fish ID course you may want to be a REEF fish watcher. Membership is free and being a fish watcher is easy and fun. Using a special slate you mark the fish you see during the dive. After the dive you record your sightings on an easy-to-use report form and return it to REEF headquarters. The thrill of discovering a rare or unusual fish is an added bonus. As a member of REEF, I have completed more than 30 surveys. During a recent trip to the Florida Keys, I spotted a fish that I have never seen before. Its appearance was somewhere between an Atlantic spadefish and a gray angelfish. Inquiring about it at the dive shop I found out that it was Pacific batfish. They are an exotic species that do not belong in the Caribbean, but two of them had been hanging around the reef for several years. Two days later diving in the same area I spotted three of the batfish and took their picture. Upon returning home I sent the picture to REEF for formal identification. Little did I anticipate the stir the pictures would cause. It appears that REEF had known about two of the batfish since 1994 but I was the first person to document three. This means they are reproducing, or coming in from somewhere. REEF contacted the National Marine Sanctuary manager where the reef is located and they are currently developing a big plan to go out and remove them. The New England Aquarium has gotten involved and agreed to take them after they are collected. NOAA's Exotic species program is also involved. They are even using my photos in the press release.
